AREAS OF OPERATION

Protected waters means an area of sheltered waters presenting no special hazards such as most rivers, harbours and lakes, designated by the Administration for the operation of small vessels and where not so designated means an area not more than 3 miles from a safe haven.

Coastal waters means an area designated as such by the Administration and where this is not so designated it means an area not more than 20 miles from a safe refuge.

Exposed waters is a term used in connection with stability criteria and means any waters that are more than 20 nautical miles from a harbour or safe refuge, or those waters which are less than 20 nautical miles from a harbour or safe refuge and which are not designated coastal or protected waters.
